Manager's Report

I'd like to start by circling back to two items in our previous meeting:

- 1. Senior Programming on weekends when other facilities are closed
- 2. Week-day programming for those with flexible schedules

I spoke with our adult services librarians. They will host a summer book club during the week this summer. It will take place on Tuesdays in June, July, and August. If it is well-attended, we can plan to keep it going and/or add a weekend session.

I would also like to thank our board member, Hari, for attending the resume building program last week that was led by our very own Employee Experiences team. He was very complimentary of Kai, Matia, and Nikki and has given some feedback that will help us with programs like this in the future. Offering books for attendance and also the attendance certificate that would be a good addition to any resume. Thank you, Hari.

Operations

- -The State Library and Archives Commission has received our accreditation report and application.
- -City Council presented the National Library Week Proclamation at Tuesday evening's meeting.
- -The Library requested approval of \$94,548.49 for new furniture in the library staff areas, which was original to the building in 1995.
- -Library Survey Overview:
- 1. Patron Satisfaction: Over 90% of patrons are satisfied with the services offered by the library, with 54.3% choosing "Very Satisfied" and 35.9% choosing "satisfied".

- 2. 37.5% of respondents use the library weekly, while 38.3% use it monthly.
- 3. 85% of respondents are satisfied with the library's hours of operation (Very Satisfied 43.8%, Satisfied 41.4%)
- 4. Children's Services: Largest segment of respondents would like a children's reading area similar to that of the teen and toddler areas.
- 5. Teen Services: Requests for more personal development programming.
- 6. Adult Services: Requested more programming with a focus on art and education.

This feedback will be rolled into the Community Experiences Master Plan Framework. Thank you for all that participated and that love the library!
