Consider approval of the minutes: January 12, 2021.

A motion was made by Councilmember Wes Mays, seconded by Councilmember Brianna Hinojosa-Smith, that Consent Agenda Items A and B be approved. The motion passed by an unanimous vote.

Consider approval of an Ordinance for PD-259R-SF-7&9, Blackberry Farm, a zoning change request from PD-259-SF-7&9 (Planned Development 259 -Single-Family- 7&9) to PD-259R-SF-7&9 (Planned Development 259 Revised-Single-Family- 7&9), to revise the Detail Site Plan and Conditions, to permit the development of 74 single-family lots and nine (9) common area lots, on 54.8 acres of land, located on the north side of Sandy Lake Road, approximately 750 feet northeast of Starleaf Road (Extended); and authorizing the Mayor to sign.

 - A. Mayor Pro Tem Mark Hill reported that Lewisville ISD recently approved boundary adjustments for the district. LISD has implemented a COVID-19 tracker that is updated daily, for more information go to LISD.net/covidtracker. 50 nurses at LISD received have received the COVID-19 vaccine on behalf of the Flower Mound Fire Department. LISD's 2021-2022 academic calendar has been approved by the board of trustees. On January 18th, LISD presented virtual Martin Luther King Jr. celebrations and video is available on YouTube, search "Beloved Community, Justice for All". LISD's STEM academy is

extending to middle schools, parents can register for virtual information sessions LISD.net/stem.

Mayor Pro Tem Hill also reported that Carrollton/Farmers Branch ISD has approved their 2021-2022 school calendar, which includes 180 days of education. The first day of school for C/FBISD will be August 10th, with the last day on May 25th.
