Introduction:

The purpose of this agenda item is to consider approval of funding the purchase of cardio machines at the Coppell Senior and Community Center from Marathon Fitness in the amount of \$75,353.20 as provided for in the CRDC fund.

With facility-wide attendance over 27,000 each year, the Senior and Community Center is heavily used by the senior residents of Coppell. Cardio machines provide users a safe and effective means of cardio training to improve overall fitness and help achieve healthy lifestyle goals.

Background:

The current cardio machines were installed in 2015 and have begun to show wear and tear and require ongoing maintenance. Replacement of the cardio machines is important for maintaining a safe, efficient, and aesthetically pleasing fitness environment. This project would replace all existing PRECORE cardio machine equipment with its updated models as well as bringing in a few additional pieces such as an Aviron Tough Series Rower (TSR1) and NuStep T6 Max Pro Standard Total Body Recumbent Stepper.

Benefit to the Community:

The replacement of the cardio machine equipment at The Senior and Community Center will provide the senior community with high quality, safe, and effective cardio training equipment to contribute to the overall health and fitness of the senior population.

Legal Review:

Fiscal Impact:

The fiscal impact of this purchase is \$75,353.20, as provided for in the Coppell Recreation Development Corporation (CRDC) fund and approved on the 2024-2025 CRDC Work Plan at a cost of \$87,000.
