S. Belt Line – All lanes are open. The contractor is continuing to work on punch list items.

DART – continuing to work on franchise relocations at Freeport and the storm drain installation across Freeport.

Woodhurst – The contractor has poured the westbound lane from Sandy Knoll to the Cul de Sac.

Andy Brown Park West Streambank Repair – The temporary repair to the bank failure is complete. Site cleanup and interim fencing is being installed before the trail can be re-opened.

Fire Station #5 - Groundbreaking is coming in June.

Community Experiences Master Plan – The next Public Input meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 6 at 6PM at the Arts Center. The community input survey will also go live on June 1. The link to the survey will be available on the website and all social media channels.

Storm Cleanup – Crews have been working all day removing trees from the roadways to the right of way. Some of the trees belong to HOA properties or individual property owners. They will be responsible for the final clean-up. Trees belonging to the City will be removed.
