

#### **CPI Increase**


The 12.5-percent increase in prices in 1980 was due primarily to increases in the food, shelter, and energy components, which accounted for more than two-thirds of the 1980 rise in the overall CPI.



Chart 1. Over-the-year percent change in CPI-U, Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, TX, March 2020–March 2023




## 12-month percentage change, Consumer Price Index, selected categories, not seasonally adjusted







From March 2021 to March 2022, Dallas-Fort Worth saw inflation of 9% -- the largest year over year increase since December 1981. It's also slightly higher than the national 8.5% inflation rate.
