## AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COPPELL, TEXAS

## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COPPELL, TEXAS, RE-APPOINTING A PRESIDING MUNICIPAL JUDGE OF THE COPPELL MUNICIPAL COURT OF RECORD NO. 1 OF THE CITY OF COPPELL, TEXAS; PROVIDING TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, the Presiding Judge, Hon. Sandra White, was appointed by the City Council on August 9, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the continuity of judicial operations at the Coppell Municipal Court of Record is critical to serving all customers of the court; and

**WHEREAS,** the Council desires to re-appoint the Hon. Judge White as the Presiding Municipal Court Judge;

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COPPELL, TEXAS:

**SECTION 1.** That in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter and State law, the City Council hereby appoints Hon. Sandra White to serve as Presiding Judge. The Municipal Judge appointed herein shall each have and possess the authority, powers, rights, duties, and jurisdiction granted to and imposed on municipal judges of the Courts of Record of the State of Texas by the provisions of State law, City Charter and the ordinances of the City of Coppell.

**SECTION 2.** That the Municipal Judge appointed hereunder shall each serve a term of office of two (2) years, set to conclude September 30, 2026, unless sooner terminated according to the provisions of law.

**SECTION 3.** That the City Manager shall negotiate with the foregoing person such engagement agreement as may be deemed necessary and appropriate and shall execute such contracts on behalf of the City and in conformance with the appointment provided herein.

**SECTION 4.** That should any word, phrase, paragraph, section or phrase of this ordinance or of the Code of Ordinances, as amended hereby, be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, and shall not affect the validity of the Code of Ordinances as a whole.

**SECTION 5.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication, as the law and charter in such cases provide.
