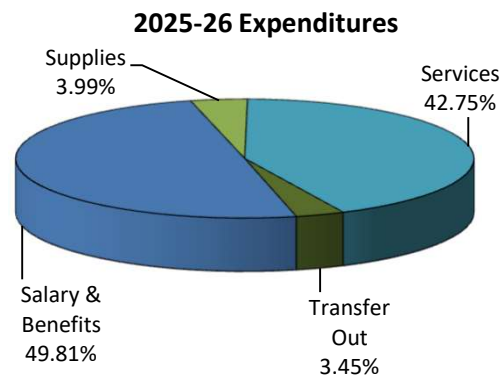
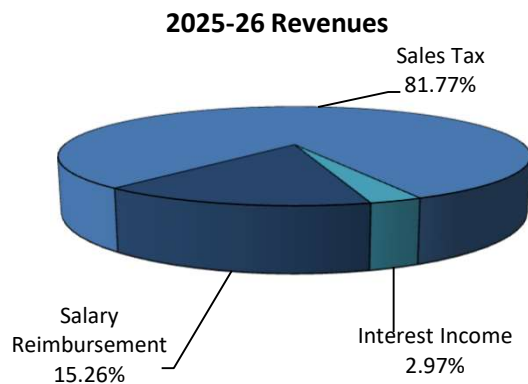
Crime Prevention District Special Revenue

The Crime Prevention District special revenue fund is restricted to crime prevention programs and services. Revenues come primarily from the ¼ cents sales tax. Expenditures in FY2026 include the School Resource Officer program, jail services, and the joint emergency dispatch center.
