Project Update

The Duck Pond Park – This project has been approved by City Council (April 11) and CRDC (April 17). A pre-construction meeting will be scheduled in the coming weeks with anticipation that the contractor, JB & Co., LLC, will begin work in mid-May. Once the project begins, it is estimated that it will take 7-8 months to complete.

Thweatt Park – Staff held a pre-construction meeting with the contractor, McMahon Construction, on April 12. Construction is estimated to begin in mid-June. From now until then, crews will begin to prepare the site for the work and a site survey will be conducted in the coming weeks. As a safety precaution for residents and park users, the park will need to be closed down for the duration of the project. Updates regarding park closure dates will be posted to City social media outlets as they become available. The estimated completion date for this project is mid-fall.

Magnolia Park Trail – Design continues to rest at 90%, as we await the Archeological Survey results required by the US Army Corps of Engineers. It is estimated that the survey results process will be completed by late June at which time the City can proceed with finalizing the design and moving forward with a formal bid process.

Moore Road Boardwalk – The work for the Moore Road Park Boardwalk continues. The contractor, Rebcon, has begun drilling the holes for the piers. The completion date for this project is early fall.

Dog Park Renovation – This project is currently in design.

Veterans Memorial – An update on this project was presented to City Council at the April 25 meeting. Council provided additional feedback and new direction for this project. Next steps are to reconvene the Focus Group to provide an update on a new process and timeline for the memorial. Park Board will receive an update as soon as one is available.
