Operations

- -The library has transitioned to online scheduling software as of January 1, 2024.
- -The state is transitioning to a new Interlibrary Loan (ILL) system. Our technician, Usha, is being trained on it and will share her expertise with staff over the course of her training schedule.
- -The Library Supervisor position opened for applications on January 5. It will close on January 19. The new supervisor is slated to start in early March.
- -Our Librarian team is getting ready to turn in their programming plans for the summer catalogue, which are due in about two weeks.
- -Our application for the Texas Municipal Library Directors Association (TMLDA) Achievement of Excellence Award has been submitted. This is a non-competitive award that is obtained through meeting all criteria in ten required areas.
- -We are looking to replace the projector in Meeting Room A, as repairs will cost just over \$8,000.
