Introduction:

The Parks and Recreation Department currently enforces building entry fees and building rental rates at The CORE, Wagon Wheel Tennis Center, and the Coppell Senior and Community Center at Grapevine Springs as set forth in the Master Fee Schedule (Recreational Fees section). These fees can often be restrictive to some, thus limiting potential customers from utilizing these facilities. It is the goal of the Parks and Recreation Department to make these facilities available to the largest number of customers possible.

Analysis:

The Parks and Recreation Department recommends proposed changes to the Master Fee Schedule (Recreational Fee section) that would allow for flexibility in establishing facility entry and rental fees.

Recommended changes include the ability to run sales, promotions, and other differential pricing options to make Parks and Recreation facilities more affordable and accessible to citizens and customers.
