Introduction:

With the redevelopment of the Andrew Brown park system, expected to be completed in July 2017, the Parks and Recreation department has an exciting opportunity to combine the City's annual fireworks event with a "grand opening" of the new park at Andrew Brown East. This event is anticipated to be the largest event that the City has ever held, which will serve to showcase the new park and all of its features as well as celebrate Independence Day.

Analysis:

This event is planned to take place on Saturday, July 1, 2017 in the newly redeveloped space at Andrew Brown East. A new name and a new logo will rebrand the fireworks event into a newer, bigger and better event. Beginning with a "Fun Run" in the morning and ending with a "large name" band music performance and fireworks show in the evening, this event is expected to last at least 12 hours. While the department is still in the preliminary planning stage, staff expects the event to include several musical performances, "pop-up" restaurants, food trucks, a special children's area, and an expanded fireworks show.
