WHEREAS, the members of the law enforcement agency of the City of Coppell have through their courageous deeds, made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their community or have become disabled in the performance of duty and unceasingly provide a vital public service;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karen Hunt, Mayor of the City of Coppell, do hereby proclaim May 15, 2017 as

"National Police Officers' Memorial Day"

and the week of May 15 - 21, 2017 as <u>National Police Week</u> in the City of Coppell, Dallas County, Texas, and urge all citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, and businesses to invest in the power of prevention and work together for the common good.
