Parkway Boulevard will be switching traffic to begin work on the southbound side. The letters on the monument sign at Denton Tap and Sandy Lake Road will be refaced. A. Councilmember Gary Roden announced that DRMC focused exclusively on transportation items for the past five months and is happy to move on now that the legislative session has ended.

B. In an effort toward healthy living, Councilmember Mark Hill reported that the Woven Clinic doubled the percentage of free flu shots administered this year, and has offered heart healthy cooking classes and Zumba classes.

C. Councilmember Wes Mays reported that Metrocrest Services is conducting a study on whether to renovate the existing building or purchase a new one. The SACK Summer Program has experienced a positive decrease in participation this year. Finally, the Metrocrest Services Food Pantry provided for 239 families, or 604 individuals, and delivered 23 meals each day.
