Reference: Discussion of Drainage Projects and the Drainage Utility District

2030: Sustainable City Government, Goal 3
Excellent and Well-maintained City Infrastructure and Facilities

General Information:

- The City is responsible for maintaining conveyance in streams
- The City is responsible for maintaining storm drain infrastructure located in drainage easements
- The City needs to implement drainage improvement projects to preserve conveyance and maintain drainage infrastructure
- The Drainage Utility District generates revenue for the operation and maintenance of the drainage system
- This is the first discussion regarding revenue needs and possible changes to the Drainage Utility District rates
