Reference: Neighborhood Traffic Management

General Information:

- The city's residential development is close to build-out
- Local traffic generation has slowed
- Regional traffic continues to grow so congestion on thoroughfares will continue to be a concern
- Residents will seek alternate or faster routes to reach their destinations
- Staff receives calls and complaints from residents regarding traffic speeding and volume on residential streets
- These complaints are typically related to school traffic or along cut-through routes
- Currently, the city's policies do not offer a framework for dealing with neighborhood traffic beyond standard signs and enforcement

Introduction/Analysis:

Staff will present options for a neighborhood traffic management program for discussion and feedback. In this first discussion, staff will seek feedback on the desire to create a neighborhood traffic management program, and some of the features to include if desired.
