9. City Manager Reports - Project Updates and Future Agendas

City Manager Clay Phillips advised that Andy Brown Park East is progressing and that the lights would be installed as proposed with new technology. The Library project is moving along nicely. Mr. Phillips thanked the Council for approving the funding for the furniture as presented this evening. Mr. Phillips further reported that the Life Safety Park is also coming along and should be open the first of 2017. Concrete has been poured for the turn lanes at Denton Tap and Sandy Lake Roads. A small water leak was discovered earlier which was being repaired this evening. Mr. Phillips also explained that a water leak had occurred on Samuel Road, for which repairs were done over the weekend. Mr. Phillips reminded the Mayor and Council of the upcoming budget workshops, and advised he would provide project costs to the Council in response to a request of Councilmember Marvin Franklin.
